ARTS AND CRAFTS

GET READING - SUMMER READING CHALLENGE

If you haven't already, join Corsham Library (at Springfield Community Campus). It's free, and means you can borrow up to 12 books for three weeks at a time, but it's not just books - there are e-books and audiobooks available too.

The Summer Reading Challenge, run by the Reading Agency via public libraries, is aimed at 4-11 year



olds. You can sign up at Corsham Library or go to summerreadingchallenge.org.uk. Children set their target (six is a good number to start with), read their library books, share their book reviews with someone at the Library and get a sticker. There are also lots of ideas for activities and games on the Summer Reading Challenge website.

Corsham Library is also running lots of activities linked to the Summer Reading Challenge every week. Why not pop in for some fun?

The Pound, on Pound Pill, is normally open from 9.30am-9.30pm, closed on Sundays. To check opening hours and see what else is going on






YOUNG ARTISTS' SUMMER SHOW

GET ACTIVE

GO FOR A WALK

There are all sorts of footpaths across Corsham - as well as the wonderful lake and parkland around Corsham Court. You can pick up a FREE Corsham Walking Map from the Town Hall or Tourist Information Centre.





GET ON YOUR BIKE

The Town Council's Active Travel Group has designed a map featuring two family-friendly cycle routes between Corsham and Lacock for the beginner and/or nervous cyclist. Pick up a copy at the Town Hall, Tourist Information Centre or Spindles, the bike shop, all on the High Street.

HOLIDAY TRAILS

The Town Council's Summer Holiday Trails return, with a Sylvanian Family Trail for younger children and the annual Pokemon Trail for older ones. For both, you need to find the characters hiding in the shop windows and write down where you saw them on the entry form. Take your forms to The Corsham Toyshop on Pickwick Road where you'll get a treat, then take the forms home to colour in the pictures on the back and return them to the Toyshop to be entered in a competition to win a bigger prize. The Trails run until 8 September. Pick up your entry forms from the Town Hall, the Tourist Information Centre, or The Corsham Toyshop, or download a copy from www.corsham.gov.uk.



FREE SWIMMING

The sessions cost £3.80 per child (£2.70 for siblings).

PLAY AREAS AND OPEN SPACES

Why not try a different play area to your local one? As well as the play area at Springfield Rec, where you will also find the parkour (free running) facility, BMX track, skatepark and outdoor gym, there are play areas at Coppershell in Gastard, Neston Rec, Dicketts Road, Meriton Rec, Westwells, Katherine Park (The Green and Little Play Area), Bences Lane and Potley. The two play areas at Potley have been improved with new equipment, and should be open for most of the summer holidays. (The wet weather slowed down the installation.)

You can also enjoy a walk at Beechfield Wildlife Area on Middlewick Lane (very restricted parking) or through The Batters, which runs along the railway line between Prospect and Brook Drive. Visit www.corsham.gov.uk for more details of our open spaces.
